





He has served in various important positions such as Chief Secretary for the Tripura state government, and also Chairman of SEBI. He brings with him wide ranging administrative experience. IIMT was lucky to get such an able person for its founding Chairman.



Our Institute is born

4 January 2011 is an auspicious day in the history of IIM Trichy as its foundation stone was laid on that day by the then Minister for HRD and Telecommunication, Shri. Kapil Sibal at Mathur, near Trichy. The foundation was made on 192.35 acres of land provided by the Government of Tamil Nadu. This piece of land is situated between Bharathidasan University and Anna University. The site is well connected to major areas in Trichy. It is approximately ten kilometres from the airport and about fifteen kilometres from the heart of the city. Thus the eleventh IIM in the country was established.

The Institute was appropriately established at the beginning of a new year. Since 2011, on the fourth day of January every year, the Institute celebrates its Foundation Day.

The First PGP Batch is flagged off

On June 15, 2011, IIM Trichy inaugurated the very first batch of its Post Graduate Programme (PGP). Mr. Gopal Vittal, Executive Director, Hindustan Unilever Limited was the Chief Guest while Mr. M. Damodaran, IAS (Retd.), Chairman, Board of Governors, IIM Trichy presided over the function. Mr. Damodaran welcomed the incoming batch, and offered sound advice to the students. Mr. Vittal provided the students with insights from his rich experience in the industry.

The institute also launched its official website www.iimtrichy.ac.in on that day. Director Dr. Agnihotri welcomed the students and introduced the faculty members to the incoming batch. The Institute had only ten fulltime faculty members on board at the time, including the Director. While the faculty numbers were small, we can proudly claim that each one of the faculty members was well qualified and committed. The incoming batch comprised of 84 students, belonging to various parts of the country. While the Institute had originally planned to have only one section of students, when the merit lists were drawn up and admission offers made, the response from candidates was so

overwhelming that in the very first batch itself, IIMT could have two sections of bright PGP students.

In line with its commitment to nature and mother Earth, IIM Trichy celebrated the inauguration of its first PGP batch by planting saplings in the academic block. The saplings planted in 2011 have now become trees, and

serve as a pleasant reminder of our commitment to the environment. Since then, on various occasions, IIMT has undertaken tree planting and similar green initiatives in the NIT Campus as well as at the site of the permanent campus at Chinna Suriyur.

The First PGPBM Batch

IIM Trichy achieved an important landmark in 2012, with the inauguration of the first batch of PGPBM students. The PGPBM is a program for working executives, with at least 5 years of industry experience. The aim of the Program is to provide management education to working executives who are unable to attend a residential MBA program such as the PGP.

PGPBM was launched to groom working executives in and around Chennai, who aspire to move into senior leadership roles. Towards this, the programme aims to develop competent professional managers, capable of working in any sector of organized activity, provide leadership and achieve excellence even while contributing to the welfare of society at large. The Program also helps IIM Trichy in its industry interface, and brings in fresh ideas and insights to faculty members.

The programme specifically attempts to:

- Equip participants with conceptual and interpersonal skills and sense of social purpose for managerial decisionmaking.
- » Develop leadership capabilities to act as change agents and be a source of motivation in the organizations they work in.
- » Nurture the desire to excel in performance without compromising integrity, honesty and fairness.

The Chennai Centre of IIM Trichy is located in the Ekkatuthangal area of Chennai, around 9 km from the airport. The centre is spread over 14,000 square feet and comprises 4 classrooms, a well-stocked Learning Resource Centre, a Computer Centre, faculty and staff offices. The centre is wi-fi enabled.

The first batch of PGPBM commenced on August 27, 2012. Twenty-eight students were admitted and the average work experience of the batch was 10 years.







The First FPM Batch

A doctoral program is essential if an institute wishes to contribute to knowledge creation. The Fellow Programme of IIM Trichy, also known as the FPM, is meant to fulfil this purpose. The IIM FPM is widely recognized as equivalent to a doctoral degree.

The Fellow Programme in Management (FPM) is a full time, residential doctoral programme of the Indian Institute of Management Tiruchirappalli (IIMT). The FPM at IIMT is globally recognized, and is a premier source of rigorous, and interdisciplinary research in all areas of business management. The programme is committed to training individuals who will excel in their areas of research through creation of quality knowledge of international standard.

FPM students specialize in the following disciplines:

- » Economics and Public Policy
- » Finance and Accounting
- » Marketing

- Management Information System
- Organizational Behaviour and Human Resource Management
- Operations Management and Quantitative Techniques
- » Strategic Management

The Mission of the FPM at IIMT is to:

- » Provide rigorous, world-class, inter-disciplinary training in all areas of business management that will equip students with the ability to conduct cuttingedge research
- » To create a group of committed and qualified individuals to create new knowledge in all areas of business management
- To meet the growing manpower needs of academic institutions in India and abroad for quality management teachers

The FPM at IIMT adheres to the following values:

- » Intellectual Honesty
- » Rigor in teaching and research
- Interdisciplinary and integrated approach

Students are expected to complete the programme within 5 years. It is possible to complete the programme within 4 years also. The maximum duration of the programme is 7 years.

The academic year 2012-13 marked the start of the first batch of the IIM Trichy FPM. Post a rigorous selection process, 3 candidates were selected for the full time residential doctoral programme.

Blood Donation Camp

As part of Independence Day celebrations, Elixir – the social responsibility club of IIM Trichy, in association with Indian Red Cross Society, Trichy organized a blood donation camp on August 14, 2012. Activities such as this reaffirm our commitment to the society. The Blood Donation Camp was an enormous success, and has been organized every year since.









The First Book Exhibition at the Learning Resource Centre










IIM Trichy Chennai Centre Inauguration

The discussion was moderated by Prof. Mouloud Madoun of IIM Tiruchirappalli.

The panel said that developing emotional engagement with oneself is the first step of nurturing engagement of an employee with the organization. One of the panelists disagreed with the notion of equating engagement with entertainment and told that engagement should help an

employee gain mastery over her task, give freedom to express and explore and create a sense of purpose that is beneficial to her, to the organization and to the society on the whole.

The panel said that true engagement stems from personal interaction with the employees with respect towards their ideas. The panel also said that any personal development program should be need based and focused and should not just be a ritual.

The valedictory by Mr. Awadesh Krishna, MD, Global Head- HR, Nomura Ltd., gave a wonderful finishing touch to the proceedings of the day. He said that Human

Resource Management is as much as a science as any other domain of management or technology. He pressed on the importance of change and described HR as "the profession of the century". Student Activities



- » The Arcturus 3.0 website had more than 2500 unique users visiting the website within a week's time










Fourth Annual Convocation










Events and delegates at INDAM 2020




Deepavali celebrations

I joined IIM Tiruchirappalli (IIMT) in May 2012, a year after its founding. IIMT was the first and the only school I applied to after my doctorate. I wanted to be part of a new and growing business school. I heard from my friends who had joined a year earlier - Professors Apalak Khatua and Jang Bahadur Singh – that IIMT, though lacking the hard infrastructure (the Institute was less than a year old at that time) had the appropriate soft infrastructure that made it a welcome place for young academics. My interactions with Professors Prafulla Agnihotri, V Gopal and K Nilakantan at the time of interview reinforced the message. The last nine years have proven my decision right as I got to play a minor role in the evolution of IIMT as a strong business school. In the process, I, too, have grown personally and professionally. While there are many memories, I would like to pick two memories that capture what I believe to be two strengths that IIMT should build on in the decades to come.

The first memory is about the initial days of Chennai Centre and PGPBM. In my first month at IIMT, I got the opportunity to be part of the team that was set up to launch PGPBM at Chennai Centre. Professor Suresh Paul Antony led the team, including Professors V Gopal, Jang Bahadur Singh, and B Srirangacharyulu. Within a short period, the programme structure was finalized. Then came the step of spreading the word around and conducting the admissions process. We launched the programme in Chennai through a Press Conference. We had a session with a veteran Trichy-based journalist who walked us through the intricacies of holding a Press Conference and drafting Press Releases. We had an Open House in Hotel Lemontree. I remember around six to eight faculty members (which was more than 50% of the faculty members at that time!) attended the open house, which lasted for the entire day, and we had a lot of walk-ins. Multiple

journeys were made to Chennai with Professor Suresh and Mr. Selvanathan, then CAO, often at short notice of less than a day, to ensure that the rented space was redesigned to make classrooms. I remember the preceding tenant had left back a statue of Lord Ganesha. We decided to retain it, and it still adorns our Chennai Centre. Mr. Kumaraswamy, then just an employee on contract (now a permanent employee), played a critical role in coordinating various academic and administrative activities in the early days. Though he did not have prior experience, he took ownership and learnt on the job. I still remember that he was the one who pointed out, a week before the launch, that we needed a nameboard for the Chennai Centre! In a short time, all members of the Institute - faculty and non-faculty - stretched themselves to ensure classes of the first batch commenced on August 28, 2012, within just three months of the start of planning. The launch of PGPBM demonstrates the spirit of learning, teamwork, ownership, and outcome-focused orientation that IIMT had in its early days.

The second memory is a personal one. I will always recall with gratitude the support extended by the Institute and its members during some of my difficult days. My mother was not well, and I had to take care of her. IIMT gave me the flexibility to spend some days of the week in Chennai Centre so that I can take care of my mother. More importantly, the Institute and all its members as a whole provided me mental and moral support during that period, acting as an extended family. I believe this 'humaneness' had been another strength of IIMT.

As IIMT completes one decade, I believe that we would all do well to tap into these strengths that defined IIMT in its formative years (humaneness, learning, teamwork, ownership and outcome-focused orientation), safeguard them and nourish them even further, so that we can build on the foundation and help IIMT evolve as an even better institution in the decades to come.

I came to know of IIM Trichy's opening through a professor in IIMB and also an FP alumnus of IIMB who happens to be my good friend. I decided I would join IIM Trichy before the convocation of the first batch. I felt great applying to an IIM. It was not an easy decision as it meant moving to a new place without my family. I had not thought through this deeply enough. However, over time I adapted and my family adapted too.

As a young institution, the academic leadership under Prof. Prafulla Agnihotri as Director and Prof. Gopal as Dean Academics provided a very heartening atmosphere even in my first casual meeting with them.

If I were to mention many of my initial experiences at IIM Trichy, all of those are written in the many little pages of my book of life which I shall cherish.

- » During my faculty seminar presentation and interview, I was as anxious as any new comer about how it went. The very next day around 12 noon when I was sitting at my work table, 24 hours after the time I attended the interview the previous day at 3 p.m, I got a call from the Director that I was selected. For a minute, time stood still. I was happy, even happier with the personalisation of the welcome, by which gesture I was touched.
- » As I joined, I met a young lady faculty, who told me that my seminar went well and that I 'was grounded'. Yes, if it made sense, I too felt good. I had always wanted to work in a place where people take academics seriously in terms of teaching and research and a rigorous system of moulding students. Over the first few interactions with other faculty, I sensed that I had got into the right place.
- » It was a whole some experience with many teas and biscuits served during the Faculty Council meetings which took care to elicit all of our individual views and arrive at a consensus on many decisions in building new systems in our young, yet enthusiastic organisation. Sometimes, it would start at 3.00 p.m and would extend till longer than 9.00 p.m. Though there were small cribs on the time we had to spend, in retrospect it is good to note we followed democratic principles.
- The team synchronisation that we enjoyed working on while planning for the Convocation as well as the review meetings to capturing learnings... where a crowd of us- faculty and staff came together to share our observations and suggested improvements.
- Our peeping into the prototype model of our present campus and buildings, which was kept in the first floor near the conference room, which many of us, including me would spend some time, watching over as we walked out of meetings many times.

- The break time for tea at 11 a.m. under the tamarind tree, where many of us gathered to have a chat over tea or coffee. The number of faculty then used to be around 10 or 12 for short chats on students comparing the Trichy students with Chennai students and about State politics and the places to see at Trichy and many more depending on time available...
- The pool side gatherings at SRM to celebrate on certain occasions, where we used to loosen up a little bit with more fun and frank talk.
- The NIT Trichy campus with a lot of neem and tamarind trees and the small shopping complex where we could go for basic stationery, food & vegetables, was an amicable township. It was a friendly atmosphere as cool as the soothing breeze which touched us in the evenings when we stepped out of our houses.
- Our Saravanan and his team of drivers who offered us support anytime on call gave us the best comfort in the most courteous manner, during personal travel, airport drops and pick up after IIMT Chennai Centre classes and especially during the transition from the old campus to the new one. We are grateful to him and his team.

The changes from then to now....

- The apartment model of houses seemed closer in terms of being in touch with people at a more personalised level compared to the bigger independent houses that we live in now, though these are also beautifully designed.
- Even though only two sections, I would feel the pressure of delivery then. Now, we teach four sections, with technology aids and online classes. Much less moving about and board work and moving within class now, especially after the COVID impact. I feel it is a luxury we as teachers have lost.
- There was a much closer physical proximity to the staff in the old campus. Many of them would wave at us, as we walked into the corridor adjacent to the Director's office. Now, it seems we have become physically distant and a formal flavour defines the place due to this. Maybe, this is about changes in organisations as they scale up.
- The Anytime 'step-ins' into each other's rooms for small clarifications on 'what to do' and the students just knocking and 'walking-in' for some clarifications. Today, we do it with appointments. I too put it this way in my course outline now.
- The visit to our present campus and the tree planting ceremony then. Now those plants have grown into mature trees. Today, as I go for evening walks, I get the child in me wondering sometimes, whether one of those beautiful trees was planted by me as I bask in fantasy and self-grandeur!!
- The Anytime coffee, I shall never forget. The perfect coffee that Kumar, one of our staff blended, whenever we wanted it. There was a good smell of brewing decoction many times, as we walked into our classrooms through the small corridor. Now, when I look back, I understand it was not just about the hot coffee, but the warmth of the people and the place!!

Can you tell us a bit about how you came to join IIM Trichy? Your background, and the circumstances in which you took up a position here?

I was in the final stages of my PhD at Bond University, Australia when I started looking at opportunities to come back to India. Working at prestigious institutes like the IIMs was always my goal as an early career academic. Keeping this is mind, I had applied at IIM Trichy which was an upcoming IIM at that stage but had already started making its mark. The selection process was very smooth and prompt. During this phase, we have moved into our new campus which has given us our own identity. The external world has started recognising IIM Trichy as an institute of prominence which is evident when one attends conferences or participates in discussions at various academic or industrial forums. Some of our colleagues who were there in the initial years have

joined other institutes. We miss them. However, new people have come in and have brought new perspectives which have added to the vibrant culture of our institute. We are no longer a new institute and are now confident to stand up to the outside world as a place which upholds greatness.

Any special memories, or events that you would like to share with us?

There are many. I have always enjoyed the exchange of ideas amongst us colleagues at our institute meets. The ones that stand out are the strategic retreats that we had. Over a span of three days, the level of discussions, the free flow of ideas, the excellent debates and discussions with the wellbeing of the institute and our various stakeholders at the forefront reaffirmed my faith in this great institute. In addition to the retreats, I have had the chance to hang out with my colleagues after completing official duties for which we had to travel outstation. Those reminded me of my college days and are memories from IIM Trichy which I would always cherish.

Anything else that you would like to mention?

Institutes are always about their people. Great people make great institutes. IIM Trichy has been following this in letter and spirit right from its outset which is why it has grown significantly and continues to do so. As a faculty member, I feel confident that we will reach new heights in the coming years through our hard work and dedication and be revered upon as a great institute both in India and abroad.

Any message for junior colleagues?

We are all family members of this eminent institute. Let us keep working unitedly and ensure that the institute continues to achieve excellence in the coming years, be a leader in its domain and set lots of good examples for its counterparts and the society at large.

During my tenure, I had

streamlined the activities of PGPM Office and I had setup the ERP system for the programme office.

How has the Institute changed over these years?

Initially, IIM Trichy functioned in a temporary campus at NIT Trichy with a small setup with few employees. Now the Institute is functioning in the permanent campus with 176 acres of land.

Any special memories, or events that you would like to share with us?

The first inauguration and first convocation are very memorable to me.

I would like to share my gratitude to all the faculty and staff members and the Directors who are all associated with IIM


