This is the mango tree where the bodies of two Dalit teenage girls were hung after they were raped in 2014. Aruna Shanbaug, a junior nurse at Mumbai's KEM Hospital, was raped and attacked by a janitor in 1973 and spent 42 years in a vegetative state. On August 9, 2024, a 31-year-old junior doctor was raped and murdered in Kolkata. There are many such stories. This issue is an act of remembrance.


