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

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

How the ASI fortifies Hindutva history

The Archaeological Survey of India was always imagined as a technical, scientific organisation, meant to conduct excavations, publish reports and advance the knowledge of the Indian subcontinent's ancient past. But this has not always been the case—the ASI's history is marked by partisanship in favour of the Hindu right-wing. An ideological lean in the organisation has been particularly helpful for the Narendra Modi government, which relies on distorting history. And in the past decade, the ASI's work across India seems to be following a script written by the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh. In Uttar Pradesh's Sinauli, for instance, where the ASI recently made startling discoveries, its officials have distorted their own findings to construct an ancient Hindu past, despite an abundance of scientific evidence that clearly contradicts its claims. From surveys at mosques such as those in Sambhal and Gyanvapi, to excavations in Modi's birthplace, Vadnagar, the ASI's misuse of archaeology to serve the RSS agenda stands as testament to how sinister the Sangh's project of revisionist history has become.
