IIM-T releases first independently audited placement report

Over 150 companies, with more than 50 new recruiters across diverse domains have scouted students of the Indian Institute of Management - Tiruchi (IIM-T), in the placement season 2024-25, according to its first-ever independently audited placement report, that was released on Wednesday.

As per an official press

release, the audited report is a direct response to the increasing need for clarity and assurance among all stakeholders in management education. "By embracing transparency, IIM-T demonstrates to recruiters that they can rely on us for accurate insights into the capabilities of our students," said institute Director Pawan Kumar Singh.

According to the report, stipends of ₹3.5 lakh for

Post Graduate Programme in Management and ₹2 lakh for Post Graduate Programme in Management - Human Resources were respectively the highest amounts secured this year.

A total of 189 companies recruited during final placements for PGPM, and 40 companies for PGPM-HR, from information technology, consulting, banking, financial services, and insurance and government sectors.

IIM-T student bags highest job offer of ₹44 lakh

TIRCHY: THE Indian Institute of Management Tiruchirappalli (IIM-T) has released its first independent audited placement report, marking a step towards transparency and credibility in its placement data. According to a press release the institute has introduced external verification of placement figures. The 2025 summer placement season witnessed robust participation, with 189 companies recruiting from the flagship Post Graduate Programme in Management (PGPM) and 40 companies hiring from the PGPM-HR course. The highest cost-to-company (CTC) stood at ₹43.94 lakh for PGPM and ₹33.12 lakh for PG-PM-HR, while the average CTC was ₹19.27 lakh and ₹17.84 lakh respectively. Over 150 firms participated in the summer placement process till July, including 50 first-time recruiters representing sectors such as consulting, IT, BFSI, FMCG, operations, and the public sector. IIM Tiruchirappalli Director Pawan Kumar Singh said, "This audited placement report is a practice followed by only 2-3 IIMs in the country, and we have implemented it for the first time with an external agency."

'National sample survey has helped shape educational policies'

Central University of Tamil Nadu Vice-Chancellor M. Krishnan has said that the national sample survey (NSS) results have opened up the higher education avenues for rural students.

Participating in the culmination ceremony of the year-long 75th anniversary of NSS held at NIFTEM-Thanjavur on November 15. Dr. Krishnan said that scientifically collected NSS data, combined with robust statistical methodologies, has significantly contributed to shaping policies that enhanced the participation of rural students in higher education.

He stressed on the importance of data-driven governance in ensuring equitable educational opportunities.
